# HIGHLIGHTS

#### Campaigning for a Progressive, Nationalistic, and Pro-People Public Transportation System in the Philippines

Inklusibo, in partnership with PISTON Land Transport Coalition, campaigned against the Jeepney phaseout under the Public Utility Vehicle Modernization Program. Inklusibo produced multiple knowledge products on the possible impact of the program. The organization also facilitated a consultation among informal transport workers, operators, and commuters to help PISTON build its pro-people transport agenda.

#### Uniting Urban Poor Communities for Decent, Affordable, and Pro-People Settlements in the Philippines

Inklusibo, in partnership with Kalipunan ng Damayang Mahihirap (KADAMAY), codeveloped the 2023 Zero Eviction Forum which aims to understand the current conditions of the urban poor in informal settlements and housing relocation sites. This was done to help KADAMAY build its national campaign on human settlements and visualize potential organizing areas inside and outside the National Capital Region.

#### Surfacing the Harms of Urban Displacement in Informal Settlements in Quezon City, Philippines

Inklusibo surfaced the campaign of the residents of Sitio San Isidro, an urban poor community forcibly evicted by the Philippine government through the Philippine Children's Medical Center. Inklusibo, along with its partner KADAMAY, exposed the unjust and violent eviction that families went through last April 2024.

Inklusibo helped process the trauma through a psychosocial activity. This was implemented in partnership with the Children's Rehabilitation Center and KADAMAY.

#### Asserting for Just, Equitable, and Consultative Policy Mechanisms for Urban Poor Communities in Quezon City, Philippines

Inklusibo supported Sitio San Roque in holding the National Housing Authority, the Philippine Commission on the Urban Poor, and the Quezon City Government accountable for the lack of consultation regarding pocket demolitions in Sitio San Roque.

The community successfully withheld the government from conducting the

demolition last November 2023. Inklusibo also helped the members of KADAMAY San Roque develop their demands to the Quezon City Government for possible settlement options within the city.

#### Building Resilience among Urban Poor Communities and Holding the Government Accountable for Ill-Prepared Disaster Response

Inklusibo supported its partner organizations PISTON, KADAMAY, and Pinagkaisang Lakas ng Mamamayan (PLM) by connecting its network to provide aid for communities affected by typhoons and monsoon rains. Inklusibo helped steer its partner organizations to build an initial campaign for climate crisis adaptation and disaster risk reduction by holding the government accountable for its ill-prepared response to the disasters.

## Because of our collective action, Inklusibo saw gradual changes on how communities and the public perceive a just, equitable, and inclusive society.

Through our collective action, informal transport workers across the Philippines pressured the government to push back the franchise consolidation deadline three times until April 2024. Although the Department of Transportation already mentioned a deadline, our partners in PISTON were able to expose the ill-preparation of the government to shift to modernization thus allowing unconsolidated drivers to continue their livelihood. Our collective action also yielded positive change as urban poor communities in the National Capital Region synergized to pursue a campaign on zero eviction. Our partners from Sitio San Isidro are also in the process of building a campaign for housing rights and human rights protection.

In our next cycle, we will continue to build solidarity among communities and strengthen the production of knowledge that can be used by communities for their campaigns and advocacies.
